YOUR HandyBin HAS ARRIVED!

Council is offering all residents a handy bin that is tidy and small enough to keep in the kitchen! When full, the corn starch bin liners from your Handy Bin go straight into your large Green Waste Bin, worm farm or compost.

Here's how you will benefit from using yours...

THEY ARE FREE! Each household can receive a HandyBin FREE from KSC along with compostable corn starch bin liners.



ECO-FRIENDLY!

Food waste at landfills generate a greenhouse gas 25 times more potent than carbon dioxide. The contents of your HandyBin are placed into your Green Bin, worm farm or compost, keeping food waste out of your red bin and our landfill.

LESS SMELL!

Breathable bin liners keep your food waste fresher for longer. This means you only need to use 1-3 of the fully compostable corn starch bin liners per week.



HANDY

It's a bench top solution to disposing ALL food scraps INCLUDING MEAT. It is equipped with an easy opening lid and a sturdy handle.



SMARTER!

It is now easier to put food-wastes into your large Green-lid garden bin (or your compost bin/worm farm if you have one). By using your HandyBin you are contributing to Shire-wide composting.

RECYCLE!

As well as recycling food waste into fertiliser, the HandyBin is made from recycled plastic. All components are made to last AND are recyclable too.



CHEAPER!

The faster we fill up our landfill, the more expensive it will be to dispose of your waste. It is cheaper for Council and ultimately you, our ratepayers, to keep food waste and other organics out of landfill.

All Kempsey Shire Council residents are eligible to receive a HandyBin, if you do not have a Green Waste Service, your bio bags can be placed in your compost or worm farm.

HOW DO I GET ONE?

Drop into Council's and see Customer Services with a proof of address (ie licence or mail) to receive your FREE HandyBin and bin liners.
