The Bush Fire Danger period will begin on 1 September and end 31 March 2025 for the Kempsey Local Government Area. During this period landowners and managers are required to obtain permits before lighting fires for land clearance or fire breaks.

Look out for Mud Scours

North Coast cattle producers are being advised to keep an eye out for Mud Scours with a case recently confirmed by laboratory testing.

It is a common cause of diarrhoea and death in the north coast region each winter and spring, often following physiological and environmental stressors such as lack of nutrition and cold, wet, windy weather.

This recent confirmation serves to remind cattle producers that the conditions are now favourable for this disease to occur and to monitor stock regularly.

- Tablets
- Mobile broadband modems

- Repeaters and smart antennas
- Medical alert devices
- NextG Wireless Link
