Regional centres across the state have a great opportunity to leverage these reforms with changes to sound and licensing regulations and the removal of certain Development Application (DA) conditions.

It's not too late to join the Kempsey Cash gift card program.


The Kempsey CBD Activation Group has launched Kempsey Cash, an exciting program to support local businesses and keep money in the community.

Regional Economic Development and Community Investment Program

The NSW Government is continuing work to ensure regional communities thrive, with \$50 million in grants becoming available for initiatives that promote regional economic development and support employment creation and retention. The second round of funding covers four key focus areas:

- Sustainable regional industries
- Aboriginal economic development and enterprise
- Community connection and capacity building
- · Improving regional service delivery

Examples of projects include:

- Tourism infrastructure which will generate regional tourism impact, for example, major nature-based tourism infrastructure, large scale event precincts and Aboriginal cultural centres.
- Investment in capital works programs for existing businesses to generate employment growth.

- Initiatives to support the attraction and retention of key workers into regional NSW.
- Tailored workforce skills development programs to support new and emerging industries including Aboriginal enterprises.

Applications close 20 February 2025.
