

Arakoon National Park Trial Bay Gaol Campground Upgrade

The National Parks and Wildlife Service will begin upgrades at the Trial Bay Gaol campground in Arakoon National Park on **Monday**, **10 February 2025**, as part of the <u>Macleay Coast Destination Master Plan</u>. The project will be completed in two stages (A and B), as shown on the attached maps.

The works are expected to finish by late August 2025. During construction, the northern section of the campground will be closed for the safety of both visitors and workers.
